**UNANTICIPATED DISCOVERY OF  
CULTURAL RESOURCES AND  
HUMAN REMAINS PLAN**

**PPEC Line 600 Project**

In order to minimize the potential for the accidental discovery of cultural resources and to ensure that Pine Prairie Energy Center, LLC (“Pine Prairie”) maintains full and complete compliance with all federal and state regulations concerning the protection of cultural resources, this Unanticipated Discovery of Cultural Resources and Human Remains Plan (“Plan”) has been prepared for the Project.

All inspectors have the responsibility to monitor the construction sites for potential cultural/archaeological remains throughout construction.

If potential human skeletal remains are found during construction, a stop work order will be issued, and Pine Prairie will notify the appropriate law enforcement personnel, Louisiana SHPO, namely, the Division of Archaeology – Louisiana Office of Cultural Development and the property owner(s). In addition, Pine Prairie will notify the FERC, the Native American tribal representatives that have requested notification of unanticipated discoveries. Provision for security to protect suspected burials from vandalism will be taken. Pine Prairie will notify FERC of the situation and will continue to keep the Commission informed as to the progress of further consultation, if required.

If potential cultural resource remains are identified during the course of construction, Pine Prairie will immediately stop tasks in the vicinity of the potential find. The appropriate law enforcement personnel and State Historic Preservation Officer (“SHPOs”) will be notified. Concurrently, SHPO-approved archaeological consultants will be dispatched to the Project area to assess the cultural finds. In the event that any unanticipated cultural resources are encountered during construction, if required, Pine Prairie will notify the FERC. Other parties will be notified, such as property owners and/or tribal representatives, if appropriate. Additional work will be suspended at the site until all criteria of Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (“NHPA”) and other related federal and state regulations have been successfully completed.

Pine Prairie will hire state-approved archaeological consultants who follow the procedures identified in the appropriate laws of the State of Louisiana. As stated in the Law, archaeological investigations of the remains must be carried out with the consent of the landowner and consultation with the appropriate tribe, if identifiable, and under the direction of archeologists employed by the state or the U.S. government, or by archeologists meeting the U.S. Department of Interior's professional qualifications standards found in the current Code of Federal Regulations.

Pine Prairie will avoid the site of the remains. If this avoidance is determined to be impossible by Pine Prairie in consultation with appropriate parties, data recovery will be performed as required/approved by the SHPO, tribal representatives, FERC, and law enforcement. Only after the human remains have been properly removed from the site will construction activities resume at the affected worksite. Under no circumstances will human remains be removed from the site without completing all coordination processes with the SHPO, tribal representatives, FERC, and law enforcement.
